The purpose of this notice is to advise you that effective July 1st, 2021, Aetna Better Health of Florida (ABHFL) will require prior authorization (PA) for the following codes: J0717, J3380, J0178.

CODE	DESCRIPTION
J0717	Injection, certolizumab pegol, 1 mg (code may be used for Medicare when drug administered under the direct supervision of a physician, not for use when drug is self-administered)
J3380	Injection, vedolizumab, 1 mg
J0178	Injection, aflibercept, 1 mg
