### 1. Vitamin D Testing Edit

As a normal business practice, claims editing software is updated regularly. Recently we updated the editing applied to vitamin D testing. Aetna Better Health of Kentucky considers measurements of serum 25-hydroxyvitamin D to be experimental and investigational for routine preventive screenings. The edit will be applied when CPT codes 0038U, 82306, and 82652 are billed with a diagnosis codes <u>not listed</u> below.

### 2. Sterilization Process

Aetna Better Health of Kentucky will change the way sterilization related CPT and HCPCS codes are reviewed and paid. These codes will no longer be managed through the prior authorization process. They will be managed by submission of the following:

- A. A copy of a signed <u>Consent for Sterilization Form</u> at the time of claim submission for members age 21 and older , *OR* for hysterectomy, a completed <u>Hysterectomy Necessity Form</u>, *OR*;
- B. Documentation of the following:
  - a. The procedure was performed on a member who is sterile as the result of conditions such as (not an all-inclusive list);
    - a prior surgery
    - menopause
    - prior tubal ligation
    - pituitary or ovarian dysfunction
    - pelvic inflammatory disease
    - endometriosis or congenital sterility, OR;
  - b. The procedure was performed in a life-threatening emergency in which a physician determines that prior acknowledgment was not possible.
