

December 22, 2021 Social Media Toolkit for Partners

According to the CDC, the Omicron variant is now the dominant strain of COVID-19 circulating in the United States and Louisiana. While data are still emerging about this new variant, it appears that Omicron is more contagious than other variants. Further, our COVID-19 trends in Louisiana are now moving in the wrong direction – and quickly. Recent COVID-19 data show statewide percent positivity, COVID-19 incidence and hospitalizations are all on the rise.

As Omicron continues to spread and because we know families are traveling and gathering these next couple of weeks, LDH has shared updated guidance on staying safe this holiday season that you can find here. In short, the important thing to remember is that we have more tools to slow the spread of COVID-19 than we did at this time last year. We know layered preventive strategies can slow the spread of COVID-19:

- Get vaccinated
- Get boosted
- Wear masks in public indoor spaces, regardless of vaccination status
- Get a COVID-19 test prior to gathering with others over the holidays

In addition, here are a few basic COVID-19 reminders:

- Stay home if you are not feeling well. People with COVID-19 have had a wide range of symptoms reported including fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting and diarrhea
- Wash your hands frequently and well.
- Do not touch your face.
- Cough into your elbow or mask.

KEY FACTS:

- Omicron, formally classified by the World Health Organization (WHO) as B.1.1.529, has been detected in at least 30 countries, and there are now known cases in 45 states across the United States, as of December 20, 2021.
- Two weeks ago, 35% of parishes were at "substantial" or "high" risk of COVID-19 spread in the community, a categorization based on a
 community indicator classification system developed by the CDC. As of Wednesday, December 22, 2021 81% of parishes fell into these two
 highest-risk categories.
- **Get vaccinated and, if eligible, get boosted** The vaccine protects you against severe outcomes from COVID, i.e., being hospitalized and dying. If you are not yet vaccinated, you're unprotected. Preliminary data show two doses of Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna may not fully protect against Omicron infection. A Pfizer-BioNTech booster shot, however, increases antibody levels 25-fold against Omicron. Similarly, early data show a Moderna booster shot can increase antibody levels 37-fold against Omicron. Getting your booster has never been more urgent.
- Regardless of vaccination status, get tested regularly Ideally, before and after any travel and before gathering with loved ones. Remember COVID tests are snapshots in time. Just because you test negative before a flight/gathering does not mean you are still negative after the flight/gathering. There are COVID test sites all over the state. Call 211 to find a test site near you. Some community-based sites will be closed on Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, NYE and New Year's Day. You can also purchase at-home rapid tests at local pharmacies and online.
- Regardless of vaccination status, mask indoors when not with your everyday household This includes private settings especially if a member of your gathering is at high risk of severe outcome (e.g., older people, underlying health condition). Masks work against all of the currently circulating variants. This is how we slow down Omicron.
- Keep your gatherings small and hold your gatherings outdoors, if possible. COVID-19 spreads more easily indoors than outdoors. Studies show that people are more likely to be exposed to COVID-19 when they are closer than 6 feet apart from others for longer periods of time.
- CDC and LDH recommend that everyone ages 5 and older get the COVID-19 vaccine. The vaccines are widely available at more than 1,000 locations in all of Louisiana's 64 parishes, including at pharmacies, hospitals, healthcare clinics, and doctor's offices.
- COVID-19 booster shots are recommended for all fully-vaccinated Louisianans ages 18 and older, and the Pfizer-BioNTech booster shot is
 recommended for 16- and 17-year-olds. A person is considered fully vaccinated if they have received two doses of the Pfizer (Comirnaty) or
 Moderna vaccine, or one dose of the Johnson & Johnson vaccine. To receive the booster dose, individuals must be at least six months past
 their COVID-19 vaccine series completion date for the two-dose vaccines.
- According to new CDC data, unvaccinated people are 10 times more likely to be infected and 20 times more likely to die due to COVID compared to a fully vaccinated person with a booster shot.
- Continue to use proven public health tools that we know slow the spread of the virus since the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic, including
 masking, practicing good hand washing hygiene, getting tested if you've been exposed, and staying home if you feel sick.

• We encourage families to reach out to their local vaccine provider ahead of time to confirm available pediatric vaccines. You can also call 211 or the COVID Vaccine Hotline at 1-855-453-0774 to find a nearby pediatric vaccination location.

HOW TO GET A COVID VACCINE IN LOUISIANA

Everyone ages 5 and older is eligible for the COVID-19 vaccine in Louisiana. Parents with children under 18 should confirm with the vaccine provider that the Pfizer vaccine is available before making an appointment.

- COVID-19 vaccines are free and widely available at more than 1,000 locations in all of Louisiana's 64 parishes, including at pharmacies, hospitals, healthcare clinics, and doctor's offices.

- Mask in all private indoor settings where someone is at increased risk.
- Test before and after any travel or gatherings.
- Get vaccinated and your booster shot if eligible.





COVID-19 cases and hospitalizations are on the rise, especially in those who are not yet vaccinated. The #Omicron variant is significantly more contagious and continues to spread across Louisiana.

If you are not yet vaccinated, you are unprotected. The vaccines protect you against severe outcomes from COVID-19 like hospitalization and death. If you are eligible, get your booster shot TODAY. Boosters strengthen and broaden protection, especially against Omicron

In light of this rapidly evolving situation around the holiday season, we are sharing updated guidance on staying safe this holiday season.





#Omicron variant of COVID-19 is now the dominant variant in the United States and Louisiana, according to @CDCgov.

There's been a sharp increase in COVID-19 cases and hospitalizations. Nearly every parish in Louisiana is at "substantial" or "high" community risk.

While Omicron seems to be extremely transmissible and breakthrough infections are likely, we're seeing the vaccines work against severe outcomes like hospitalization and death. We're also seeing #boosters strengthen and broaden protection against COVID-19.

You are 10 times more likely to test positive and 20 times more likely to die from COVID-19 if you're unvaccinated.





More data is needed to know if #Omicron infections cause more severe illness and death than other COVID-19 variants.

We DO know the vaccines work against severe outcomes like hospitalization and death and boosters strengthen and broaden protection against COVID-19.








Public health officials have warned for weeks that the U.S. could face another Covid wave this winter. THE NEXT BIG SURGE IS HERE.


#Omicron is now the dominant strain and the unvaccinated are the most at risk. Unvaccinated people are 10 times more likely to test positive for COVID than fully vaccinated people, and they're 20 times more likely to die from COVID than fully vaccinated people.

More than 2.5M people in Louisiana have gone sleeves up already, but for us to fight Omicron and put this pandemic behind us, it's critical that many more people get vaccinated, and those who are eligible, get boosted.
